TERNA: International Safety Award Presented to the Joint Venture Salini Impregilo - TERNA

TERNA, subsidiary of GEK TERNA GROUP, announces that the joint venture Salini Impregilo – TERNA, which has undertaken the construction of the Stavros Niarchos Foundation Cultural Center, has won an International Safety Award with merit from the British Safety Council in recognition of its commitment to keeping its workers and workplaces healthy and safe during the 2015 calendar year.

The construction of Stavros Niarchos Foundation Cultural Center which consists of a 170,000 m² Park, the National Library of Greece, the Greek National Opera, a Car Parking Station with 1,000 parking spaces and three (3) auxiliary buildings, began 2013 and will be completed in a few days. More than 1,000 people have worked for approximately 3,000,000 hours for the implementation of the project.

The above recognition is a strong statement of TERNA's continuous efforts, in these 45 years of its presence in the construction sector, to provide its employees with the best possible health and safety conditions at the workplace, either at office spaces or at worksites, in Greece and all over the world.
